9A Legislative Update – Inclement Weather Days

The House Education Committee held a hearing this week on snow day forgiveness legislation. HB 4206 allows the state superintendent to waive days of instruction that were canceled due to a state of emergency that was declared by the Governor. This is in addition to the six (6) forgiven, plus three (3) additional waived, days permitted under current law. HB 4206 was amended to revise the percentage requirement for rescheduled days of instruction due to snow days from 70 percent to 60 percent

11A 2018-2019 Potential Calendar Adjustments

District administration is working through several 2018-2019 school calendar adjustment scenarios in an attempt to capture additional instructional minutes/days reduced by inclement weather. The legislature's decision will also impact any adjustment to the calendar. We want to be proactive, but premature decisions could also hinder, versus help, the District.

11B BJSHS Spanish International Tour Proposal – Costa Rica

The Board will be asked to support an out-of-country trip for BJSHS Spanish students to travel to Costa Rica, in summer of 2020, via the Education First Educational Tours company. Spanish teacher, Kristen Sanderson will

provide further details about the trip. The trip is nine (9) days long, departing on Tuesday, June 16, 2020 through Wednesday, June 24, 2020 so students would not be absent from school. No district funds will be used for the trip; it is self-funded by students.

11C New Hire – Paraprofessional Per IDEA Law and Student I.E.P.'s

The Board may be asked to hire an additional, Highly Qualified Paraprofessional to meet Individual Education Plans (IEP) of an influx of special needs students.
